What is a Nurture Group?

A Nurture Group is a small group with two adults supporting them at all times. Groups are designed to offer short term, focused intervention which aims to remove any barriers to learning which may arise from social, emotional or behavioural difficulties.

Some children have, for a variety of different reasons, missed out on some early years experiences which can make a busy classroom environment difficult to cope with. The Nurture Room aims to provide some of those missed experiences in an inclusive, positive and supportive environment. Those attending remain part of their class and usually return full time within 2 - 4 terms.

Benefits of a Nurture Group



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Our Nurture Room aims to be a welcoming and safe space. It is designed to be a mixture of a home environment and learning area. Areas include a cosy living room, a kitchen area with dining table, a listening station, role play area and a quiet space to relax and reflect if needed.
