Saturday: APPLICATION PROCESS

9.00am: Arrive and Registration

Meet the team and receive your Applican pack with all the information you will need for the 2 day course

9.30am: Welcome and weekend outline with initial Q&A

A quick run through of the timetable for the weekend and a chance to ask questions

10-11am: Why Medicine? Which medical school?

The reasons you are interested in medicine will in themselves help direct you towards the medical school best suited to you. We will run through the course structures of the UK medical schools and highlight the most important differences that will help you in final decisions

11-12pm: Medicine in journalism - how to brush up your knowledge of current affairs

The best way to be prepared for interview is to be aware of medicine on a national and international scale. We will give you a basis to this understanding in your packs and discuss how you can build on it in preparation for upcoming interviews

12-1pm: Personal statement - the outline

The basic template for a personal statement is important for medicine and there are some tips we have picked up from our experiences that we will share

1-2pm: Lunch

2-4pm: How to make your personal statement personal?

All medical students will be including work experience and extra-curricular activities but we will help demonstrate how we made ours stand out from the thousands of other applicants

4-5pm: How to prepare for medical entrance tests

A brief overview of the different entrance tests, our scores and how we prepared for them to help you make the best choices for your application

Sunday: SELECTION PROCESS

9-10.30am: Interview Overview and Technique with sample questions and answers

We will explain our general and personal tips for dealing with the wide variety of interview types and work through the extensive bank of sample questions in your packs. This will demonstrate how to prepare answers to the general topics that repeatedly are asked throughout interview systems

10.30-11am: Problem solving questions

We will work through examples of problem solving questions used throughout medical school interviews of different styles

11-1pm: Mock interview demonstration and Q&A session to both the interviewer and interviewee

A complete 15 minute mock interview will be conducted with students asked to make notes on observations and then an interactive discussion of the interview will take place including a general interview Q&A session

1-2pm: Lunch

2-3pm: Ethical discussions and scenarios

Ethical scenarios and questions are becoming increasingly more common so we will discuss how best to approach these questions and discuss the recurring themes

3-4.30pm: Mock MMI interview

A mock set of 12 multiple mini interview stations will then be carried out with different student volunteers having the chance to be involved.

4.30-5pm+: Overall Q&A session
