We are pleased to announce that Dr Martin Baker will be coming to DGS to give a talk on March 24th at 6pm.

Martin studied mathematics and theoretical physics at Cambridge University at undergraduate and post-graduate level in the 1970s; he joined the British Antarctic Survey in 1976 as an atmospheric physicist and meteorologist and worked in the Antarctic for ten years, for seven of those years he was a research station base commander: Martin was also a lecturer in dynamic meteorology and applied climatology in Cambridge for three years before moving to Edinburgh with his wife in 1989 to take a teaching position Loretto School in Musselburgh, where he worked for 28 years as teacher, head of department and Director of Studies before retiring in 2016: once a keen amateur classical guitarist, he has lectured extensively on mathematics and physics, and their relationship to art and music.
