- Who is it aimed? - Children aged 3-11 and adults who work with or have children aged 3-11.
- Content (Range of Info/Activities/Videos/Advice/Statistics etc.) -
 - Good information for children on being smart on the internet, games, safe searching, digital footprints, mobiles, music, file-sharing and social networking. Each page has the basic information plus short video clips of children talking about the various issues. Links are given to other useful sites.
 - The 'I work with kids' and 'I have kids sections' give a wide variety of resources for teachers and parents of children including games and activities, information and two charming on-line story books on the use of the internet and possible consequences of sharing hurtful posts.

- Who is it aimed? – Sections for young people, teachers/professionals and parents/carers
- Content (Range of Info/Activities/Videos/Advice/Statistics etc.)
 - Section for primary/secondary pupils-top tips, games, forum, blog, useful contacts
 - Section for professionals/teachers-contacts for online safety bodies, useful advice, information about social networking, safety procedures for the workplace including an INSET presentation.
- Overall review – Lots of information for a wide range of people especially young people. Easy to navigate and interesting to read-lots of articles and short bits of info that pupils could read without losing concentration.... They also have their own twitter account to keep people informed so are using the social media sites they are advising on. Resources page for teachers and parents with clips, audio and literature.

- Who is it aimed? - Adults, particularly parents
- Content (Range of Info/Activities/Videos/Advice/Statistics etc.) - Very in depth. Covers everything from how to set up yourself PC, banking/shopping, protecting your business, to current affairs and the latest scams that are happening on the news.
- Overall review - A well thought out, concise website. Lots of info but it doesn't bore you with too much unnecessary text.

Met Police Internet Safety website

- Who is it aimed at? - Parents, Pupils
- Content (Range of Info/Activities/Videos/Advice/Statistics etc.) - The site has a lot of information about keeping safe online, what children can do to make themselves safe and where to go if they feel abuse is taking place. From this point of view it is quite reassuring and has email addresses where abuse can be reported and, one thing I particularly liked, a link to access 'cyber-mentors' to help if in trouble. There are useful sections on different types of abuse including cyber bullying and online grooming and a lengthy section on making 'friends' - again with useful tips.
- Overall review - My main concern is that the site is a little wordy and seems more aimed at adults or, perhaps, older teenagers. I think younger ones will be put off looking in great detail because of the old-style lay-out and the amount of information on the screen. This is a shame because the home page is really quite dynamic in the way it links in with other kinds of problems faced by young people including gun crime and travelling safely.
