CDT

Pupils are using *Homestyler* software as an introduction to floor plans and 3D Interior Design. Introduction to Engineering Science. Pupils are also Creating Charts using data in Canva and creating procedural instructions and an illustrated how to guide.

23 April – 30 April

History

Pupils are continuing the focus on Scotland's History, now reaching the modern period. Pupils are looking at the impact of World War I on Scotland and the Scottish soldiers' experience of war including trench warfare. They will soon move on to examine the use of conscription and the case study of McCrae's battalion will be examined - pupils will have a film to watch and questions to answer, football fans should find this especially interesting! Then it is on to the social, political and economic consequences of war with a look at the Red Clydeside.

French

Pupils have been asking people out, invitations, buying clothes and discovering the Cannes Film Festival.

Having studied the Five Pillars of Islam in depth, pupils will now investigate the following:

Computing & Business

Science

Depending on which practical group pupils are in, they will be working on one of the following topics:

- DNA and the ethics surrounding DNA profiling, as well as the techniques related to forensic science.
- "Fuels of the future", including STEM design skills relevant to the world of work.
- "Science in the News": how to analyse and evaluate scientific literature.
