If you've wondered what difference leading edge technologies are making to schools, now's your chance to find out.

Next week, Preston Lodge has been selected to host the only Scottish stop on Google's ["Apps for Education" Roadshow](#). You'll see a large pop-up dome classroom appear in the school

grounds, and leaders from schools around Scotland will be visiting during the day.



On the evening of Thursday, 21st May, we're welcoming parents to Google's pop-up classroom. You'll be able to see examples of what's already possible, and learn about the new Connected Learning Network that's about to arrive. And you'll find out how both will help improve e-safety.

The Connected Learning Network will remove some current barriers to learning by enabling networking of a much wider range of devices,

from school ereaders, scientific equipment and loan devices to personal mobile phones, notebooks and tablets. It will also provide guest access for parents, careers advisors and other partners, in a similar way as is done in East Lothian's libraries and other public buildings.

Don't get the idea, though, that this is all about school. It's also a chance simply to learn about what's now possible, and how. These tools aren't just used in school: they're increasingly how people in today's organisations are able to work effectively from anywhere.
