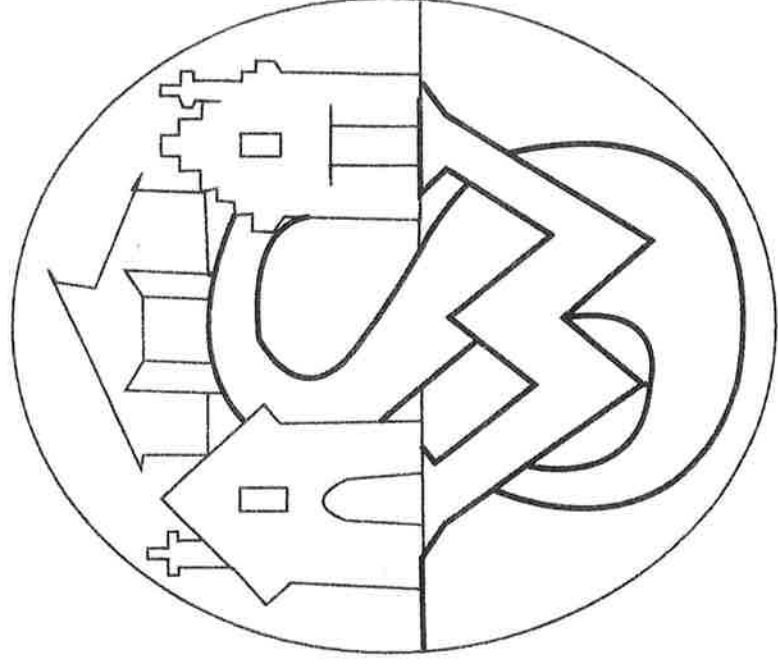

We would always encourage our children to read as much as possible! While reading books are not coming home there are many ways your child can still enjoy reading. For younger children sharing a story together or having them retell their favourite story to you.

P3-7 are involved in using AR in school and can take quizzes on any books read at home to work towards their target.

Any and all reading will support your child's development!

Maths/Numeracy

Using number as part of everyday conversation is a powerful consolidation of work learnt in class. This can be working out how much money they need to buy something, telling the time, counting the stairs in the house, helping to measure ingredients for cooking or identifying numbers in the environment!

All children also have a Mathletics login which gives them access to age/stage appropriate maths games online.
