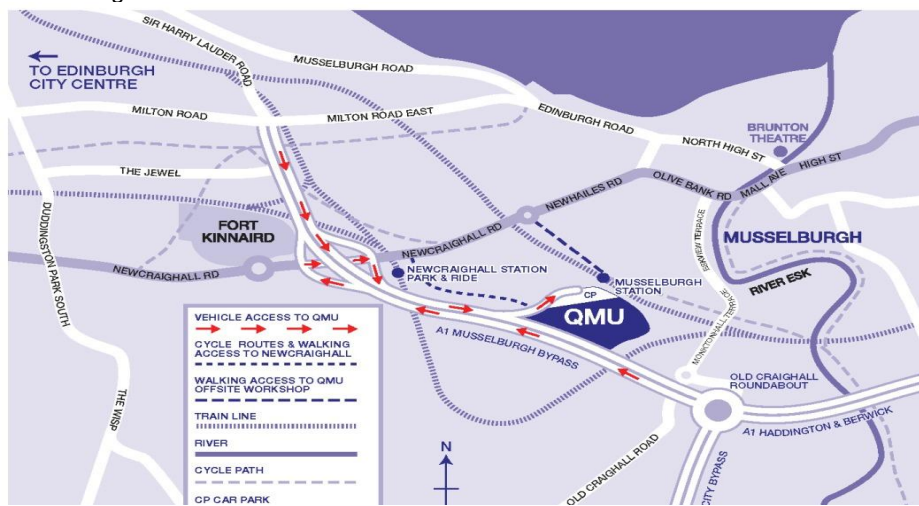

How to get there and map

BY CAR: Do **not** programme our post code location into GPS etc or you will be sent to a closed barrier that does not allow private vehicle access to the campus. Car access to our campus is by the 'Queen Margaret' exit on the SOUTHBOUND carriageway of the A1. When you come off the slip road, turn left at the bottom. The car park is signed as the first entry on the right. Do not be anxious about the 'alligator teeth' at the entrance to the car park; they drop down as you drive over on the way in. Please park in any bay marked 'Visitor Parking'.

Bus from East Lothian: From central Musselburgh, you can either catch a number 30 Lothian bus on the east side of Musselburgh High Street,
