Health & Wellbeing

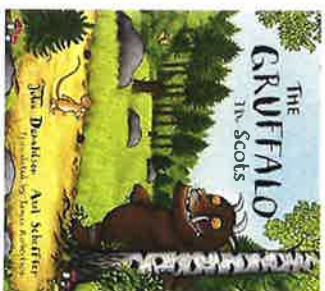
