

GARVALD VILLAGE

At the East end of the village stands the Parish Church, built in the 1100s but remodelled in 1829. It is bright and airy inside, and still used for fortnightly worship.

At the West end sits the former Free Kirk, with its free-standing bell tower, which is now the village hall. The village also has a small green, the Garvald Inn and a large community park, woodland and children's play area.

DONOLLY RESERVOIR (1.5 HOURS CIRCULAR)

From Garvald, take the bottom road heading west out of the village, sign-posted Carfrae. After ½ km, just before the road starts to climb, turn left towards Garvald Mains, and about 30m along this road, turn right where a round core path sign marks the start of the route. You'll see core path signs at several points to keep you right.



Follow the path right round the Donolly Reservoir. There is a bit of mud on the south side and the path winds around in and out of trees on the north side.
