



LAMMERMUIR HILLS VIEW

1.6KM EACH WAY

Head out of the village on the Haddington Road (B6369) and take the first track on the right. At the top of the track head around two sides of a field until you see a "Public Path" sign. Continue along a field margin and turn left onto a track heading up to Winding Law. There are great views across to the Firth of Forth to the north, and the Lammermuir Hills to the south.

GIFFORD VILLAGE

The 17th century village of Gifford was developed in association with textile and paper mills, one of which produced Bank of Scotland notes.

Across the road from the Town Hall, the Avenue boasts a fine row of lime trees planted in 1680. Further along the Avenue is the green, and the play park which sits on the old bleaching field. The area enclosed by stone wall was the pound, or holding cattle overnight prior to being driven to market.



Yester Church, which faces you as you look along Main Street, dates from 1710.

COMMUNITY WOODLAND

There's an exceptional set of paths, built by the community, hidden in the woods by Eaglescairn Farm.

Head along Station Road and into the woods where you'll find a route map of the well-maintained and sign-posted trails. These trails are good for buggies and wheelchairs.
