

# MORHAM KIRK

From the village hall walk West towards the trees, past the last house. You'll see a stile on the right with worn steps and a sign to Morham Kirk. Walk along the edge of the field, keeping Morham burn to your left. You'll reach open fields and the view of Traprain Law will open up again

Hidden from the roadside, the small wooded glen of Morham burn ends suddenly when it meets the church. The present building, built in 1724, replaced an earlier 17th Century church. For centuries, a tower house stood opposite the church, but very little remains now.

There's part of a 9th Century Anglo Saxon cross from Morham Kirk in the National Museum of Scotland in Edinburgh. It had been reused when building the 18th Century church. The design is of beautifully interlaced knots.

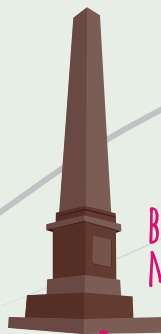
# BALFOUR MONUMENT

2.6KM WALK / CYCLE

There's an amazing view point just half an hour's walk from Morham which is definitely worth it! Follow the road towards Whittengehame and you can't miss it - the monument is right by the road.

The red sandstone monument is dedicated to James Balfour (1820-56), father of both the British Prime Minister Arthur Balfour (1848 - 1930) and the embryologist Francis Balfour (1851-82).
